



## LOG YARD TREATMENT APPLICATION GUIDE

Timber Pro Log Yard Treatment is designed as a treatment to reduce the unwanted discoloration of logs that are green or projects that must sit for months prior to finishing.

The Log Yard Treatment will offer short-term protection from the discoloration of the sun's ultraviolet rays as well as other environmental damage that would naturally occur to bare wood left exposed to the elements. Log Yard Treatment will also help reduce surface checking and warping associated with rapid moisture loss in the logs.

**SURFACE PREPARATION:** The surface must be free from dirt, discoloration, and loose fibers. The cambium layer must be removed to allow the Log Yard Treatment to penetrate into the logs. Protect, cover, or mask all nearby surfaces not being treated.

**APPLICATION METHOD:** Stir contents well. Saturate the wood using a low-pressure sprayer. Apply the product heavily either on a low-pressure garden-type sprayer or HVLP sprayer. Higher-pressure sprayers tend to atomize the product resulting in loss of product. Allow the product to absorb, and then brush out any runs or drips.

**PRECAUTIONS:** Do not apply if rain or freezing temperature is likely to occur. Do not allow the product to freeze.

**CLEAN UP:** Clean up overspray, drips and splashes immediately with water. Clean all tools & application equipment with soap & water.

**COVERAGE:** Log Yard Treatment covers approximately 250-350sqft/gallon depending on wood surface porosity.

**DRYING TIME:** Drying time approximate 16 hours, depending on humidity and temperature.

Apply final finish coats prior to Log Yard Treatment wearing off. 3 to 5 months depending on type of weather exposure is the average amount of time that Log Yard Treatment will provide some protection but user must take responsibility to monitor the health and condition of the logs during that period .
